#### Notes:

- This meeting was a check-in with the KCA board to talk about project priorities and potential funding strategies.
- Jim Charlier gave a brief presentation (available on this project web site) on the status of the project and remaining issues to be resolved. The presentation focused primarily on the outcomes from the September 28 public workshop in Koloa and on the emerging project plan (a specific list of recommended improvements).
- The board discussed the project plan and offered the following recommendations:
  - First, it should be possible to extend Kiahuna Plantation Drive directly north to the "cane haul connector" (R5 on the map). This would eliminate the crossing of Hapa Trail by the roadway connector (R7 on the project map) and also would avoid the need to rely on the "spine road" (R17 on the project map) for a new connection to the "cane haul connector." This is essentially a design detail since the corridor need would be shown regardless of the specific alignment.
  - Second, the "spine road" (R17) could be split into two projects at about the location of R7 on the project map since the two segments would be needed in different time frames.
  - Finally, project R16 (the reconfiguration of the Maluhia Road/Eastern Bypass intersection) should be given green (high priority) status in the plan.
- Members of the board believe we should think about how this plan (the Koloa-Poipu Area Circulation Plan) should be "gifted" to the County. Although the plan is being done with County involvement and reflects the stated intent of both the Administration and the Council, it is not actually being done *by* the County. How do we transfer "ownership" of the plan to the County and what action does Council take in accepting "ownership?"
- Members of the board think there may a need for a concurrency provision that explicitly ties development in some parts of the project map to needed roadway projects serving those areas.
